



1. Deregulated Administrative Fee. Non-tariffed products are subject to a Deregulated Administrative Fee (“DAF”). The DAF is determined as a percentage of billing and is used to recover the costs carriers incur to maintain, provision, develop and advance the underlying infrastructure essential to providing internet and data-related products and services. The applicable percentage is subject to change from time to time and applies to products that are not subject to rate preapproval regulation.

2. Property Tax Allotment. Property Tax Allotment (“PTA”) is a surcharge that is used to recover amounts paid to various taxing jurisdictions for state and local property taxes imposed on MetTel or its underlying providers. The PTA is subject to change from time to time. Federal Universal Service Fund (FUSF) and other taxes, fees and surcharges may apply to PTA.

3. Carrier Portal Charge. The Carrier Portal is a proprietary IT management web platform that allows companies to securely and efficiently manage their technology, end-to-end. It is designed and built to help enterprises improve business-process efficiencies and get the most out of their growing IT infrastructures.
